Welcome

Welcome to Summer School 2025!

- In Township High School District 211, we are proud to boast quality programs, exceptional staff, and enriching opportunities for students.
- All students residing in High School District 211 boundaries may enroll in our tuition Summer School program.
- Summer School provides opportunities for students to improve academic skills and to explore new interests. It also enables incoming freshmen to become familiar with the high school routine.
- The Summer School 2025 program will continue to operate under a four-day week (Monday through Thursday) structure for all programs, with a total of 26 days, 13 days each semester.
- The class time will be 8:00 a.m. – 1:15 p.m. for Palatine and Hoffman Estates High School, and 7:15 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. for Fremd and Schaumburg High School. Conant High School will be closed this summer due to construction.
- Due to construction projects at Conant High School, no classes will be held at this location. Conant’s academy, special education, and specialty courses will be reassigned to Hoffman Estates High School. Conant’s academic classes will be reassigned to Schaumburg High School. Additionally, due to the calendar conflict with elementary school District 15, all freshman courses at Palatine High School and Fremd High School will only be offered in 2nd semester.
- Online registration for current D211 students will begin on Monday, March 31st at 8:00 a.m. for Conant, Hoffman Estates, and Schaumburg High Schools, and on Wednesday, April 2nd at 8:00 a.m. for Palatine and Fremd High Schools. Online registration for incoming freshmen will begin April 21st at the school the student will attend in the fall. All are encouraged to register early. Walk-in registration also is available.
- For your information, decisions to run most classes will be made by Friday, May 23rd. Class sizes must be limited, and classes will close when the limit is reached. Classes with insufficient enrollment will be canceled. Depending on course enrollment, specified courses (*identified with an **) may be combined or facilitated in a hybrid environment.
- We hope you enjoy your experience with us, and maximize this opportunity to learn.



Registration:

- In most cases, your child pre-registered their academic class(es) for summer school with their counselor during the regular school year. Please contact the Student Services office at your child's home high school for information on your child's recommended course.
- After doing so, you may use the online system to reserve the course and pay associated fees. If your child is scheduled for a class that requires no fee, **the registration process must still be completed.**
- To register online for summer school course offerings, District 211 parents have the option of using the Infinite Campus Parent Portal. You can access the Infinite Campus Parent Portal through either the District website at adc.d211.org or through your high school's website. To do so, each parent must have a username and password. Your activation key was included with the Parent Portal Activation letter which was mailed in October. If you have lost or misplaced your activation key or login information, you may contact the Student Services office at your high school. For further questions or options regarding your student's summer school courses, please contact your school's Student Services department.
- Just a reminder, due to construction projects at Conant High School, no classes will be held at this location. Conant academic courses will be reassigned to Schaumburg High School. Conant academy, special education, and specialty courses will be reassigned to Hoffman Estates High School. Additionally, due to the calendar conflict with elementary school District 15, all freshman courses at Palatine High School and Fremd High School will only be offered in 2nd semester.

Online:

First Semester Registration

- Online registration begins Monday, March 31 at 8:00 a.m. for all current freshmen, sophomores, and juniors at **CHS, SHS, and HEHS** and closes at 3:00 p.m. on Thursday, May 29.
- Online registration begins Wednesday, April 2 at 8:00 a.m. for all current freshmen, sophomores, and juniors at **PHS and FHS** and closes at 3:00 p.m. on Thursday, May 29.

Second Semester Registration

- Online registration begins Monday, March 31 at 8:00 a.m. for current freshmen, sophomores, and juniors at **CHS, SHS, and HEHS** and closes at 3:00 p.m. on Tuesday, June 24.
- Online registration begins Wednesday, April 2 at 8:00 a.m. for all current freshmen, sophomores, and juniors at **PHS and FHS** and closes at 3:00 p.m. on Tuesday, June 24.

Incoming Freshmen Summer School Registration

- Summer School registration begins Monday, April 21 for all incoming freshmen. All registration hours and closing dates apply. Registration must be completed through the school the student will attend in the fall.

If your child desires to take a summer school course other than the courses currently available in their INFINITE CAMPUS Portal, the parent will need to contact their school's student services office.

Parochial school students who live within High School District 211 boundaries may register as Out-of-District Students for summer school. These students should register at the D211 school they would have attended. Registration days and times for these students are: First semester - May 28 & May 29 until 3:00 p.m. Second semester - June 23 & June 24 until 3:00 p.m.

Payment:

After students have met with their counselor and have made course selections, registration can be completed for students at the high school they will attend during the 2025-2026 school year OR online. Online payment is available for District 211 families by using the *Infinite Campus Portal* found on your child's home school website. Online payment can be made by credit card using Visa, MasterCard, Discover, or American Express. Parents desiring to complete registration online may do so by using the same username and password that has been previously provided. Walk-in and online registrations must adhere to deadlines as stated. Payment for walk-in registrations may be done by cash, check, or credit card.

Transportation:

Students who pay in person for transportation will receive an email with a temporary bus pass from the school where they register. If payment for transportation is made online, parents will be notified via email when a bus route has been assigned. A permanent bus pass will be issued to eligible students on the first day of attendance.

Emergency Information

In the event that it is necessary to cancel classes because of an emergency situation, information will be available on the District 211 website (adc.d211.org) or via the news media.

General Information

Academic Refund Policy

- Students may receive a 100% refund if they withdraw from a full-tuition academic course **before the first class meeting**.
- Students enrolled in Summer School may receive a partial refund for only the following reasons:
 - Any long-term illness or injury causing withdrawal from Summer School. The refund request must be accompanied by a doctor's verification of the medical condition causing withdrawal.
 - A death in the immediate family.

- Academic refund checks for 1st semester will be issued on or near the end of June, and 2nd semester on or near the end of July.
- NO REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN FOR ANY OTHER REASONS.
- A school administrator and the District Summer School administrator must approve all refunds which will be subject to a review of initial payment. ORIGINAL BUS PASS MUST BE SURRENDERED TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR A FULL TRANSPORTATION REFUND. Refund requests without a bus pass will be delayed until the pass is returned.

Food Service Options

Transportation

District 211 school buses will run for morning credit classes only. District transportation is not provided for afternoon classes, nor is it available for pickup of students for athletic/activity camps before or after they are complete. The fee is \$35 per semester. **Because of irregular schedules, students in driver education classes may not be able to benefit from bus service.** All students are asked to be at their assigned corner five minutes before the route start time and remain there until the bus arrives. Please contact your school's Student Services office with any bus assignment questions.

Summer School Regulations

Frequently Asked Questions

Summer School is an academic enrichment program for students who desire additional learning opportunities. Time is precious; each day is equivalent to a week of study during the regular school year. Rules are enforced strictly, quickly, and consistently to maintain an atmosphere conducive to learning. ***There will be no exceptions made to the rules of conduct or attendance.***

- ◇ Do not schedule summer vacations during the Summer School session.
- ◇ Students dropped from class do not receive refunds.
- ◇ To report an absence or ask a question, please call the Summer School office at the school the student is attending.

Daily Attendance

What are the attendance rules?

- A student who misses the first two days of a Summer School semester will not be allowed to attend class that semester.
- A student who misses the first two days of a Summer School semester will forfeit all tuition and fees.
- Upon obtaining a third absence to academic classes (or any combination of absences/tardies equaling three absences), a student will be dropped from Summer School.

Tardies

- A tardy of one hour or less is recorded as one-half day of absence; more than one hour equals a full day. Students arriving late or leaving early must report to the attendance office.

Behavioral Expectations

What kind of behavior is expected?

During the summer, behavior expectations are the same as during the school year. Students may not wear hats in school. Students who use or possess tobacco or controlled substances; are truant or excessively tardy; or commit acts of gross misconduct will be immediately dismissed from Summer School. These students will forfeit credit and fees for the semester.

Are students required to wear I.D.s?

Students are required to wear and properly display a current school I.D. card while attending Summer School in District 211. Student I.D. cards will be distributed on the first day of class. The I.D. card must be worn around the neck and visible at all times during the school day except when specifically exempted on a temporary basis by an authorized faculty/staff member. Only lanyards issued by the school may be used to wear and display the I.D. card. Students may not embellish their I.D. card with any drawing or writing. I.D. cards must be surrendered upon request of any staff member, including bus drivers and student supervisors. The I.D. card must be shown to the staff member on duty when entering buses, checking out media materials, and leaving the school for any purpose. Students without an I.D. card on a school-issued lanyard must obtain a replacement card or lanyard immediately upon entering the building. Disciplinary consequences may apply for failure to properly wear and display a current I.D. card.

Academic Questions

What are the study requirements?

Students should expect a great deal of homework each day. Absentees must turn in missed work immediately upon their return to school.

What is the final examination policy?

A student who is absent on the last day of the semester will not be allowed to take the final examination and will not receive course credit. In addition, the student will forfeit all fees for the entire semester and receive a failing grade by default. Final examinations will be given during the last two hours of class. *Final examinations will not be given early.*

How much credit does a course earn?

Students receive one-half unit of credit for each semester of an academic course. Driver education courses and physical education earn one-quarter unit of credit for the course.

What does “audit” mean?

Students may apply to audit a course. A notation will appear on the school record that the student attended the course and received no credit. Audit students pay full fee and must adhere to the same attendance guidelines. Audit forms are obtained from the Summer School principal.

Other

Can students who reside outside of D211 boundaries apply for summer school?

The D211 summer school program is only allowed for students who reside within the D211 boundaries. This includes parochial students who live within D211 boundaries. These students may register as out of district students.

ART

A15303 Art

Credit: 1/2 unit • **Level:** All

This course is the equivalent to the first semester of Painting, Drawing, and Printmaking 1 offered during the regular school year. Students will learn the basics of drawing, color, and design through a variety of projects and materials.

Schaumburg High School – 2nd Semester

A90303 Building an Art Portfolio

Credit: 1/2 unit • **Level:** 2, 3, 4

Prerequisite: Placement in Art Studio or AP Art Studio classes in the upcoming school year.

This course will prepare current or incoming art studio students to better meet the challenges and expectations of building a personal art portfolio. This portfolio can be used for college and scholarship application as well as submission to the College Board for AP Art Studio. This summer course is designed to improve the student's ability to (1) conduct a sustained investigation through practice, experimentation, and revision, guided by questions; (2) skillfully synthesize materials, processes, and ideas; and (3) articulate, in writing, information about one's work. During this course, students will be led through various studio projects that will help stimulate and improve these skills.

*BUSINESS EDUCATION

B28503 Consumer Education

Credit: 1/2 unit • **Level:** 2, 3, 4

Students will receive instruction in budgeting, savings and investing, credit, insurance, comparison shopping, banking, income taxes, and consumer protection. As referenced to the study requirements previously mentioned in this catalog, students should expect at least two hours of homework each day. Out of school Internet access to accommodate the accelerated curriculum schedule is required. This course fulfills the Consumer Education graduation requirement.

DRIVER EDUCATION

P90203 Driver Education (Behind the Wheel & Classroom)

Credit: 1/4 unit • **Level:** 2, 3, 4

To enroll in this program, students must be 16 years of age by September 30, 2025. **All students must have a valid Illinois learner's permit prior to the first day of class.** State law requires that all students must have received a passing grade in eight courses during the two semesters prior to enrolling in driver education. Both classroom and behind-the-wheel instruction are offered. Seats are limited in all sections. **Early registration for this course is essential.** Only residents of High School District 211 are eligible for this course.

Those who do not attend a District 211 high school during the regular school year must register at the G.A. McElroy Administration Center, 1750 S. Roselle Road, in Palatine, and bring a copy of their birth certificate and verification of academic eligibility. (Obtain this form from your own school's administration.)

Because of irregular schedules, students may not be able to benefit from bus service.

Key Dates:

- April 28, 2025* *First day students can go to Student Services to get a permit application*
- May 5, 2025* *First day students can return to Student Services with a valid permit and request a seat for the course. After the seat request is processed, parents must pay for the course prior to the section being assigned. As seats are limited in each time slot, students will be able to rank the order of their preferred time slot and location when turning in their valid permit.*

Course runs from June 2nd through July 10th (one week shorter than regular summer school).

P91203 Driver Education (Classroom Only)

Credit: 1/4 unit • **Level:** 2, 3, 4

To enroll in this program, students must be 16 years of age by September 30, 2025. State law requires that all students must have received a passing grade in eight courses during the two semesters prior to enrolling in driver education.

Because of irregular schedules, students may not be able to benefit from bus service.

Course runs from June 2nd through July 10th (one week shorter than regular summer school).

*ENGLISH

E10101/E10201 English

Credit: 1/2 or 1 unit • Level: 2, 3, 4

This course is for students who need to make up freshman English credit. It focuses on literature, composition, and language.

Fremd High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Schaumburg High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

E20101/E20201 English

Credit: 1/2 or 1 unit • Level: 3, 4

This course is for students who need to make up sophomore English credit. It focuses on the study of literature, composition, and language. Units of speech and communication are part of the work at this level.

Fremd High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Schaumburg High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

E30101/E30201 English

Credit: 1/2 or 1 unit • Level: 4

This course is for students who need to make up junior English credit. It includes work on writing and the study of American literature. Students will learn research skills and complete a short research project each semester.

Fremd High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Schaumburg High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

E42201/E42202 English

Credit: 1/2 or 1 unit • Level: 4

Each semester of this course satisfies one semester of the senior-level English requirement for those who need to make up senior English credit for graduation. First semester covers a survey of English literature. Second semester includes improvement of writing skills.

Fremd High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Schaumburg High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

*MATHEMATICS

M11401/M11402 Algebra I

Credit: 1/2 or 1 unit • **Level:** 2

This course introduces students to the fundamental principles of algebra.

*Fremd High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both
Schaumburg High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both*

M11701/M11702 Algebra I

Credit: 1/2 or 1 unit • **Level:** 2

This course is available for students wishing to retake because of a failing grade or desiring to improve academic achievement.

*Fremd High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both
Schaumburg High School– 1st or 2nd Semester, or both*

M21401/M21402 Plane and Solid Geometry

Credit: 1/2 or 1 unit • **Level:** 2, 3, 4

This study of geometry involves studying the axioms and theorems that relate points, lines, planes, and solids. An overview of plane and solid geometry is presented through geometric constructions, measurement formulas, and limited writing of formal proofs.

*Fremd High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both
Schaumburg High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both*

M21701/M21702 Plane and Solid Geometry

Credit: 1/2 or 1 unit • **Level:** 2

Prerequisite: M117 Algebra I (A,B,C) or acceptable performance on algebra examinations is required.

This comprehensive study of plane and solid geometry includes constructions, formulas for measurement, and formal proofs. It is based on the axioms and theorems that relate points, line, planes, and solids. Algebraic techniques are integrated into the solution of many geometric problems.

Fremd High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both
Schaumburg High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both*

M31401/M31402 Algebra 2

Credit: 1/2 or 1 unit • **Level:** 3, 4

Prerequisite: Previous enrollment in M314.

This course reviews topics introduced in *M114 Algebra 1* and expands upon them. The topics include methods of solving equations and inequalities, graphing techniques, and logarithms. A graphing calculator is required. **Note: This course is for credit replacement only. Sophomores and juniors who enroll in this course during Summer School must continue their study of mathematics to continue their preparation for college and career readiness.**

M31701/M31702 Algebra 2

Credit: 1/2 or 1 unit • *Level:* 3, 4

Prerequisite: Previous enrollment in M317.

This course is designed for students who are proficient in topics from *M117 Algebra 1*. The ideas presented involve advanced techniques of graphing, methods of solving equations and inequalities, and functions. Students are prepared to begin their study of pre-calculus. This course requires a graphing calculator. **Note: This course is for credit replacement only. Sophomores and juniors who enroll in this course during Summer School must continue their study of mathematics to continue their preparation for college and career readiness.**

Fremd High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Schaumburg High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

M43801/M43802 Trigonometry/Calculus A

Credit: 1/2 or 1 unit • *Level:* 2, 3, 4

Prerequisites for Semester 1: Department chair or teacher recommendation.

The **first semester** of this course covers trigonometry for students preparing to take *M449 AP Calculus AB* the following fall.

Prerequisites for Semester 2: *M408, M438 (1st semester), and department chair approval.* The **second semester** of this course covers limits, derivatives, and applications of derivatives in preparation for *Advanced Placement Calculus* coursework in the fall. Second semester requires a graphing calculator. Students enrolled in this class during second semester Summer School must be recommended to be enrolled in *M449* or *M479* for the fall. Final placement will be determined by their Summer School teacher.

WELLNESS / PHYSICAL EDUCATION

P90303 Physical Education (Make-Up)

Credit: 1/4 unit • *Level:* 3, 4

Students who must repeat physical education to qualify for graduation may take this course. Activities vary according to abilities and interests of the students enrolled in class. Bus service is **not** available for this course, which meets in the afternoon.

Palatine High School – Monday through Thursday; June 2 - July 16, 1:30 - 4:00 p.m.

Schaumburg High School – Monday through Thursday; June 2 - July 16, 1:30 - 4:00 p.m.

P94401/P94402 Wellness

Credit: 1/2 or 1 unit • *Level:* 1, 2

The goal of the District 211 Wellness Program is for students to acquire the knowledge and skills necessary to attain and maintain healthy levels of well-being. The interrelationship of physical, intellectual, emotional, and social health of our schools is the foundation of this course. **Note:** This course is only for credit replacement for Freshman and Sophomore Wellness.

Schaumburg High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

SCIENCE

S13101/S13701 Biology

Credit: 1/2 or 1 unit • **Level:** 2, 3, 4

This course applies to the science sequence required for graduation. This course is available **only** for those students wishing to **retake** because of a failing grade or desiring to improve academic achievement.

Fremd High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Schaumburg High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

S22101/S23301 Physical Science

Credit: 1/2 or 1 unit • **Level:** 3, 4

This course applies to the science sequence required for graduation. This course is designed for student study of the principles of measurement, kinetics, mechanics, optics, electricity, magnetism, and chemistry. Class work emphasizes the learning of science through laboratory experiences. This course is available **only** for those students wishing to **retake** because of a failing grade or desiring to improve academic achievement.

Fremd High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Schaumburg High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

S23401/S23402 Earth Science

Credit: 1/2 or 1 unit • **Level:** 3, 4

This course applies to the science sequence required for graduation. This course is available **only** for those students wishing to **retake** because of a failing grade or desiring to improve academic achievement.

Fremd High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Schaumburg High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

S33201/S33202 Chemistry

Credit: 1/2 or 1 unit • **Level:** 3, 4

This course applies to the science sequence required for graduation. This course is available **only** for those students wishing to **retake** because of a failing grade **or** desiring to improve academic achievement.

Fremd High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Schaumburg High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

SOCIAL STUDIES

G14301/G14302 World Geography

Credit: 1/2 or 1 unit • **Level:** All

This course is designed to combine a survey of geographic principles pertaining to physical, economic, and political aspects of the world with an application of these principles to the major continents.

*Fremd High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both; *(Except FHS and PHS Freshman – 2nd Semester only)
Schaumburg High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both*

G14601/G14602 World History

Credit: 1/2 or 1 unit • **Level:** All

This course is a survey of western and non-western civilization.

*Fremd High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both; *(Except FHS and PHS Freshman – 2nd Semester only)
Schaumburg High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both*

G34101/G34201 U.S. History

Credit: 1/2 or 1 unit • **Level:** 3, 4

This course is required for graduation. This course emphasizes objectives and study projects covering the history of our nation from the American Revolution to the present.

*All Schools – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both
Conant High School Classes will be held at Schaumburg High School*

G44101/G44201 Civics

Credit: 1/2 or 1 unit • **Level:** 4

This course applies to the social studies sequence required for graduation. The objectives and content of this course focus on the study of four major social disciplines: anthropology, economics, political science, and sociology.

*All Schools – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both
Conant High School Classes will be held at Schaumburg High School*

G99203 Preparing for Advanced Placement in the Social Sciences

Credit: 1/2 unit • **Level:** 1

Prerequisite: Students should be enrolled in A.P. Social Studies courses in the fall or department chair recommendation.

This program is open to incoming-freshman (or sophomore first time AP Social Studies students) who are registered for advanced placement social studies course work during their freshman (or sophomore) year. Students will develop writing and analytical skills. The course is a one semester, summer class offered to students interested in entering the advanced placement curriculum and further developing the skills necessary to be as successful as possible. **This course is offered for regular academic credit.**

Fremd High School – 2nd Semester
Schaumburg High School – 1st Semester*

WORLD LANGUAGE

L96603 Spanish Proficiency Enrichment

Credit: 1/2 unit • **Level:** 1, 2, 3, 4

Prerequisite: Previous Spanish language experience.

This course is designed for a beginning/intermediate level student of Spanish with previous experience in the language. The focus is to strengthen input and output skills (proficiency) necessary to be successful when transitioning to the next level of language instruction.

Palatine High School – 2nd Semester

Schaumburg High School – 2nd Semester

SPECIAL EDUCATION COURSES

Extended School Year (ESY) is a special education service provided beyond the regular school year, at the recommendation of a student's IEP team, in an effort to prevent the student from regressing and to promote the maintenance of skills developed during the regular school year.

M900 Foundations for Algebra (ESY)

Credit: 1/2 unit • **Level:** 1

This three-week course is designed to provide specific instruction to develop and reinforce the foundational and prerequisite skills necessary for a successful transition to high school mathematics. Instruction will be provided in a smaller setting with flexible pacing based on student needs.

Palatine High School – 2nd Semester

Hoffman Estates High School – 1st or 2nd Semester

R91003/R92003 Summer Enrichment Academy 1 (ESY)

Credit: 1 unit

As recommended within a student's I.E.P., the *Summer Enrichment Academy 1* will provide instruction to those incoming freshmen who are identified as needing basic skill development in the areas of mathematics, English, and reading. Students recommended for this six-week summer program will receive instruction in mathematics each day to increase basic skills and begin developing pre-algebra skills. Students also will receive reading and English instruction each day. A variety of learning activities will help students develop skills in reading, decoding, comprehension, grammar, and written expression. The goal of this six-week special education course is to accelerate student learning, strengthen academic preparation for the high school curriculum, and to help the student acclimate to high school.

Hoffman Estates High School – 1st and 2nd Semester

R94003/R95003 Summer Enrichment Academy 2 (ESY)

Credit: 1 unit

As recommended within a student's I.E.P., the *Summer Enrichment Academy 2* will provide instruction to students who have just completed their freshman year and are identified as needing to continue developing in the areas of mathematics, English, and reading. Students recommended for this six-week summer program will receive instruction in mathematics each day to enhance skills learned during the previous year and to develop the skills necessary to succeed in the second year of mathematics involving basic algebra. Students also will receive reading and English instruction each day with a focus on comprehension, vocabulary, and writing skill development.

Palatine High School – 1st and 2nd Semester

Hoffman Estates High School – 1st and 2nd Semester

R96001/R97002 Summer Enrichment Academy 3 (ESY)

Credit: 1/2 or 1 unit

As recommended within a student's I.E.P., the *Summer Enrichment Academy 3* will provide instruction to students who have just completed their sophomore year and are identified as needing to continue developing in the areas of mathematics and/or English and reading. Students recommended for R960 will receive instruction in mathematics to enhance skills learned during the year and to develop the skills necessary to succeed in the third year of mathematics. Students recommended for R970 will receive instruction in reading and English with a focus on comprehension, vocabulary, and writing skill development.

Palatine High School – 1st and 2nd Semester

Hoffman Estates High School – 1st and 2nd Semester

R98001/R98002 Supplemental Skills (ESY)

Credit: 1/2 or 1 unit

This academic course teaches basic communication skills and mathematics skills. Students continue to develop social skills and become oriented to the high school setting.

Palatine High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Hoffman Estates High School – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

R99001/R99002 Supported Work Experience (ESY)

Credit: 1/2 or 1 unit

The class focuses on pre-vocational work skills: following directions, work completion, attendance, punctuality, communications, and listening skills. Students participate in a variety of short-term supported job training activities.

Palatine High School – 1st and 2nd Semester

Hoffman Estates High School – 1st and 2nd Semester

V91001/V91002 STRIDES Enrichment – Level 1 (ESY)

Credit: 1 unit

This course focuses on skill development in the areas of algebra, mathematical applications, reading decoding, reading comprehension, grammar and written expression. The academic courses also will teach basic communication and social communication skills.

Higgins Education Center – 1st and 2nd Semester

V92001/V92002 STRIDES Enrichment – Level 2 (ESY)

Credit: 1 unit

This course focuses on skill development in the areas of algebra, mathematical applications, reading decoding, reading comprehension, grammar and written expression. The academic courses also will teach basic communication and social communication skills.

Higgins Education Center – 1st and 2nd Semester

V93001/V93002 Introduction to New Endeavors Transition (ESY)

Credit: 1 unit

As recommended within a student’s IEP, this 6-week introduction to New Endeavors Transition course will provide students who have completed their senior year and have been recommended for participation in the program, with instruction and experiences in the areas of vocational training and post-secondary education and training preparation.

Higgins Education Center – 1st and 2nd Semester

V99001/V99002 Introduction to Adult Transition Program (ESY)

Credit: 1 unit

As recommended within a student’s I.E.P., this six-week Introduction to Adult Transition Program course will provide students who have completed their senior year and have been recommended for participation in the Adult Transition Program with instruction and experiences in the areas of daily independent living, vocational training, accessing the community, and recreation/leisure.

Palatine High School and Higgins Education Center – 1st and 2nd Semester

INCOMING FRESHMAN ACADEMY COURSES

Incoming freshman students are individually invited to attend specific courses to assist them in developing the skills necessary to become successful in high school.

R92403/R92503 Incoming Freshman Academy

(by invitation only – mandatory attendance)

Credit: 1 unit • Level: 1

The *Incoming Freshman Academy* will provide instruction in both mathematics and reading to incoming freshmen. The goal of this program is to accelerate student learning in reading and mathematics; strengthen academic preparation for the high school curriculum; and help the student acclimate to high school. Students selected for this **mandatory** six-week summer program will receive two hours of instruction in both mathematics and reading on a daily basis. Students who successfully complete the program may advance to higher curricular levels.

Schaumburg High School – 1st and 2nd Semester

Conant High School will be held at Hoffman Estates High School – 1st and 2nd Semester

R92603 Incoming Freshman Academy Mathematics

(by invitation only – mandatory attendance)

Credit: 1/2 unit • **Level:** 1

This **mandatory** three-week course provides necessary support to students in need of accelerating their progress toward algebra readiness. Students will study topics aimed at increasing their number sense and conceptual understanding of pre-algebra concepts. This project-based classroom will use manipulative experiments, cooperative groups, and technology to enhance student learning. At the end of the program, students will be retested for placement into *Algebra I*.

*All Schools – 1st or 2nd Semester *(Except PHS and FHS – 2nd Semester only)*

Conant High School will be held at Hoffman Estates High School

R92703 Incoming Freshman Academy Reading

(by invitation only – mandatory attendance)

Credit: 1/2 unit • **Level:** 1

This **mandatory** three-week course is designed to strengthen skills needed to be successful in high school and to become life-long readers. This intensive course focuses on improvement in reading fluency, comprehension, critical thinking, writing, and vocabulary. A variety of reading strategies will be taught through the use of short stories, novels, and nonfiction selections.

*All Schools – 1st or 2nd Semester *(Except PHS and FHS – 2nd Semester only)*

Conant High School will be held at Hoffman Estates High School

INCOMING FRESHMAN INVITATION COURSES

R90403/R90503 Freshman Project Excel (by invitation only)

Credit: 1 unit • **Level:** 1

Project Excel is designed to provide intensive English and mathematics skill enhancement at a rigorous level so students will be able to advance to accelerated level coursework as freshmen. An efficacy-trained instructor will work with the teacher in the classroom to help students develop skills to reach their capacity as a student and as an individual.

*All Schools – 1st and/or 2nd Semester *(Except PHS and FHS – 2nd Semester only)*

Conant High School will be held at Hoffman Estates High School

M91703 Preparation for Algebra 1 (by invitation only) – Classroom

Credit: 1/2 unit • **Level:** 1

This course prepares students for a successful first year of high school algebra by refining the prerequisite skills needed for algebra. Students work with a mathematics teacher in a self-paced, traditional classroom environment.

This course is suggested and open to all students enrolled in M117 Algebra 1 or M147 Advanced Algebra 1 during their freshman year of high school. This course also is available in an online classroom format (see M927).

*All Schools – 1st or 2nd Semester *(Except PHS and FHS – 2nd Semester only)*

Conant High School will be held at Hoffman Estates High School

M92703 Preparation for Algebra 1 (by invitation only) – Online

Credit: 1/2 unit • **Level:** 1

This course prepares students for a successful first year of high school algebra by refining the prerequisite skills needed for algebra. Students work from home to complete self-paced units within the six weeks of the Summer School calendar. Students may email a mathematics teacher with individual questions throughout the six weeks of the online course. Students must attend a one-hour class the first week of Summer School (multiple options are available) to receive their software passwords. Students also must attend a 90-minute class the last week of Summer School (multiple options are available) to take the final exam in person. Students must have access to the Internet to participate in this course. The date and time options will be sent directly to students enrolled in the course by May 12 (prior to full refund deadline).

This course is suggested and open to all students enrolled in *M117 Algebra 1* or *M147 Advanced Algebra 1* during their freshman year of high school. This course also is available in a traditional classroom format (see *M917*).

Online course is open to all schools – Course must be completed within the six weeks of Summer School

M99203 Preparation for Geometry (by invitation only)

Credit: 1/2 unit • **Level:** 1, 2

This course is open to incoming freshmen or sophomores who would benefit from instruction in complex algebra skills. This course prepares students for *M217 Plane and Solid Geometry* and *M218 Accelerated Geometry*. Department chair or junior high school recommendation required. **This course is offered for regular academic credit.**

*All Schools – 1st or 2nd Semester *(Except PHS and FHS freshman – 2nd Semester only)
Conant High School will be held at Hoffman Estates High School*

M99303 Preparation for Algebra 2 (by invitation only)

Credit: 2, 3, 4 unit • **Level:** 2, 3, 4

This three-week mathematics course is designed to strengthen geometry and algebra skills needed for success in *M317* and beyond. This course is open to sophomores, juniors or senior students who would benefit from instruction in algebra and geometry. This course prepares students for *M317 Algebra 2*. **This course is offered for regular academic credit.**

*All Schools – 1st or 2nd Semester
Conant High School will be held at Hoffman Estates High School*

M99401/M99402 Algebra 1 (by invitation only)

Credit: 1 unit • **Level:** 1

This six-week course is for invited freshman, based on qualifying scores and recommendations, to complete Algebra 1 in the summer. Algebraic symbolism, simplifying expressions, solutions to equations and the graphic representations associated with variables are among the course topics. **This course must be taken both semesters.**

Hoffman Estates High School – 1st and 2nd Semester

SOPHOMORE ACADEMY COURSES

R93403/R93503 Sophomore Academy **(by invitation only – mandatory attendance)**

Credit: 1 unit • Level: 2

The *Sophomore Summer Academy* will provide instruction in both mathematics and reading. Instruction is designed to accelerate student learning in reading, writing, and mathematics. Students selected for this *mandatory* six-week summer program will receive two hours of instruction in both mathematics and reading on a daily basis. Students who successfully complete the program may advance to higher curricular levels.

All Schools – 1st and 2nd Semester

Conant High School will be held at Hoffman Estates High School

R93603 Sophomore Academy Mathematics **(by invitation only – mandatory attendance)**

Credit: 1/2 unit • Level: 2

This *mandatory* three-week course provides necessary support to students in need of accelerating their progress towards meeting state standards in mathematics. This project-based classroom will use manipulative experiments, cooperative groups, and technology to enhance student learning. At the end of the program, students will be retested to determine their sophomore year mathematics course placement.

All Schools – 1st or 2nd Semester

Conant High School will be held at Hoffman Estates High School

R93703 Sophomore Academy Reading **(by invitation only – mandatory attendance)**

Credit: 1/2 unit • Level: 2

This *mandatory* three-week course will focus on improving student reading fluency, comprehension, critical thinking, writing, and vocabulary. A variety of reading and writing strategies will be taught through the use of short stories, novels, and nonfiction selections.

All Schools – 1st or 2nd Semester

Conant High School will be held at Hoffman Estates High School

SOPHOMORE INVITATION COURSES

R95503 Sophomore Project Excel (by invitation only)

Credit: 1/2 unit • Level: 2

Sophomore Project Excel is a three-week program designed to provide intensive reading and writing skill enhancement for students who are invited to attend. Students will receive insights in strategies for improving their overall performance as a student. Successful completion of the course will provide the basis for stronger academic performance in reading and writing *which will assist students in developing the requisite skills for Advanced Placement coursework.*

*All Schools – 1st or 2nd Semester *(Except FHS)*

Conant High School will be held at Hoffman Estates High School

JUNIOR INVITATION COURSES

R96503 Junior Project Excel (by invitation only)

Credit: 1/2 unit • **Level:** 3

Junior Project Excel will specifically target students entering their senior year to emphasize college and AP-level writing skills. **This class is open to PHS and HEHS students only.**

Palatine High School – 1st Semester

Hoffman Estates High School – 1st or 2nd Semester

ENGLISH LEARNING COURSES

R94201/R94202 EL Academy English — Beginner Level A **(by invitation only – for freshmen/sophomores)**

Credit: 1/2 or 1 unit • **Level:** All

This course provides support to English language learners who are in the initial stages of acquiring the listening, comprehension, oral language, reading, and writing skills needed for English language proficiency. Students are placed in the appropriate level of *EL Academy* based on recommendation only. Students attend a three- or six-week course that prepares them for the Illinois State ACCESS Test and fall courses.

*All Schools – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both; *(Except PHS and FHS Freshman – 2nd Semester only)*

Conant High School will be held at Hoffman Estates High School

R94301/R94302 EL Academy English — Intermediate Level B **(by invitation only – for freshmen/sophomores)**

Credit: 1/2 or 1 unit • **Level:** All

Students who are in the process of learning the English language will continue to improve their listening, reading, speaking, and writing skills through this course. Students are placed in the appropriate level of *EL Academy* based on recommendation only. Students attend a three- or six-week course that prepares them for the Illinois State ACCESS Test and EL Level 3.

*All Schools – 1st or 2nd Semester, or both; *(Except PHS and FHS Freshman – 2nd Semester only)*

Conant High School will be held at Hoffman Estates High School

SPECIALTY COURSES

R99303 Preparing for Advanced Placement in Development of Literacy Skills

Credit: 1/2 unit • **Level:** 2, 3, 4

This course will prepare current District 211 students to better meet the challenges and expectations of advanced placement curriculum. This course is designed for students to receive accelerated academic preparation in the areas of reading, writing, and analytical skills. This course is a one semester, summer class. This program is open to only District 211 students who have been placed in an AP-related course for the upcoming school year. *This course is offered for regular academic credit.*

All Schools – 1st or 2nd Semester

Conant High School will be held at Hoffman Estates High School

T80203 Evening Vocational Seminar

Credit: 1 unit • **Level:** 4

This work/study evening course includes classroom work and on-the-job experience. Students receive 1/2 unit of credit for classroom work and 1/2 unit of credit for work experience. *Students must be employed and have completed 8 semesters of high school.* Attendance during the first class meeting is mandatory. This course meets the consumer education graduation requirement (6 weeks).

Mondays and Wednesdays at Fremd High School, 6:00 - 10:00 p.m., Room 164

COLLEGE MAJOR & CAREER CLUSTER EXPLORATION COURSES

R95101 Interactive and Information Technology I: Principles

Credit: 1/2 unit • **Level:** All

Do you like creating images or games on a computer? Do you have a technical and creative mind? This pathways exploration course allows students to investigate possible college majors and career pathways by introducing students to a variety of essential skills for the Information Technology professional. Students will explore Computer Information Systems, Software Design and Development, Visual Design, and Hardware Design and Control Systems. This project-based, hands-on course will help students determine a focus in Interactive and Information Technology and provide them with skills needed for all paths in the field.

Fremd High School – 1st Semester

Schaumburg High School – 1st Semester

R95202 Interactive & Information Technology II: Digital Design & Development

Credit: 1/2 unit • **Level:** All

Prerequisite: *Interactive and Information Technology I: Principles.*

This second technology pathways exploratory course focuses on design applications using the skills received in the Principles course. Advanced topics such as microcontroller programming, sensor priority, animation, and web connectivity will enable students to develop a product design for presentation at the end of the course.

Fremd High School – 1st Semester

Schaumburg High School – 1st Semester

T93601 Diesel Technology

Credit: 1/2 unit • **Level:** All

A fundamental course designed to increase the knowledge of diesel engine design, fuel control systems, forced induction, and emission controls. Use of both classroom and lab will occur to demonstrate competencies. ***This class is open to all District 211 students. Students attending from a south-end high school must provide their own transportation.***

Fremd High School – 1st Semester

T94601 Building Construction I

Credit: 1/2 unit • **Level:** All

While building a project on the high school campus, students will become familiar with stages of construction from site preparation to interior finish work. This may include the following skills: carpentry, siding, roofing, drywall, electrical, plumbing, heating, painting and staining, and various flooring applications. All tools are provided by District 211. ***This class is open to all District 211 students. Students attending from a south-end high school must provide their own transportation.***

Palatine High School – 1st Semester

T94702 Building Construction II

Credit: 1/2 unit • **Level:** All

This course is a continuation of the project being built first semester in *T946 Building Construction I*. While continuing to build a project on the high school campus started first semester, students will become familiar with stages of construction from site preparation to interior finish work. This may include the following skills: carpentry, siding, roofing, drywall, electrical, plumbing, heating, painting and staining, and various flooring applications. Students are not required to complete *T946 Building Construction I* prior to enrolling in *T947 Building Construction II*. All tools are provided by District 211. ***This class is open to all District 211 students. Students attending from a south-end high school must provide their own transportation.***

Palatine High School – 2nd Semester
