Transition classes provide scholarships

- •We offer 3 classes that can lead to a scholarship in December to Harper or Northwest Suburban College
- Work on math and reading skills to enter college or career pathway program
- Learn about a career and job skills.



Bridge to Healthcare Class

- •Class 4 hours per week for 13 weeks on Tuesday nights (D214 has it on Monday nights)
- •Online with Zoom 2-3 hours with teacher and 1-2 hours of homework on Google Classroom and an App.
- Explore health careers, resume building and interviewing



College and Career Ready Bridge

- •Class 6 hours per week for 12 weeks on Tuesday/Thursday nights 6:30-9:30 pm
- Online with Zoom, Google Classroom and an App
- Explore any career, resume building and interviewing

ESL: English Classes for Non Native Speakers

Free classes! (Just attend class and take 2 tests) 6 levels of English from Beginners to Advanced (test determines it...DO NOT GUESS on the pre test!)





ESL English as a Second Language

- Evening Classes at:
 - •Conant High School 6:30-9:30 pm, no childcare
 - Higgins Education Center 6:00-9:00 pm,
 - Palatine High Schools 6:30-9:30 pm, no childcare
- •Two nights per week:
 - Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/Thursday
 - •Begins the week of September 5



ESL Testing

- •Level determined by a reading comprehension test by the State...cannot request! DO NOT GUESS on the placement test!
- •If reading test is too high, a speaking/listening test is given by appointment.
- Advanced Students might take another test to identify reading skills



ESL Classes

- •Classes teach all four skills: reading, listening, writing and speaking
- Math skills
- Digital skills
- Soft skills to keep a job
- Cultural information for community living
- Seats are filled on a first come first served basis and if there is an open seat. As of today, there are openings in every level.



ESL Classes

- You must come to class (no more than 4 absences)
- •Practice soft skills like being on time and staying to the end....recommendations!
- Lend textbooks or buy your own
- Can lend some Chromebooks or hotspots
- •Any materials that you borrow must be returned if you need to end class before we end!
