Enrollment - Deadline February 15

One time process completed via the D211 Infinite Campus Portal and requires the following documents to be uploaded:

- *Proof of Residency (gas bill, electric bill, property tax bill or leasing agreement in parent/guardian's name)*
- Original Birth Certificate

*Those living with someone else will require an affidavit completed and residency meeting

Annual process to:

- confirm a student's attendance for the next school year.
- verify all demographic information is accurate
- pay annual instructional fee

Information regarding annual process sent at a later date.

Physicals and Immunizations

- All 9th grade students must have up-to-date physicals and immunization records on file to attend school on August 11, 2022 (form included in packet)
- Physicals must be completed within 12 months prior to the start of school (August 12, 2021 or later)
- Sports physicals are not accepted for 9th grade physicals.



- Interdisciplinary activities, field trips, team building, goal setting


AP Seminar


