

Requirements to Obtain a License

1. Must pass 2 phases of driver's education; "Classroom" and "Behind the Wheel" A student may repeat each phase one time under current state reimbursement laws.
2. Learner's permit and receipt
3. School photo I.D. or library card (with name and address)
4. **Original copy** of your birth certificate
5. Information on license eligibility will be mailed to you
6. A parent or guardian must provide the Secretary of State facility with proof that you received 25 hours of practice time with someone at least 21 years of age. (Log Sheet)
7. If applicable: Cooperative Driver Testing Program Certificate if you qualify for and pass the test given by your instructor.

What does getting a "WAIVER" mean?

You are eligible to take the road test with your certified instructor at school. You will still be required to bring the documents listed above to the Secretary of State Facility and get your picture taken for your license.

You do not have to take the driving test at the facility if you qualify for and pass the "Waiver" test given by your high school instructor.

*Note: If you are born on one of the spot check dates listed on the bulletin board, then you will still have to take the driving test at the facility.

How do you qualify for the "WAIVER"?

1. Be an **above average** driver as determined by your driving instructor.
2. Successfully complete BTW.
3. Earn a **"B" average** or higher in the classroom for the semester. More than 3 absences from classroom must be made up.
4. Pass the Cooperative Driver Testing road test given by your driving instructor.
