

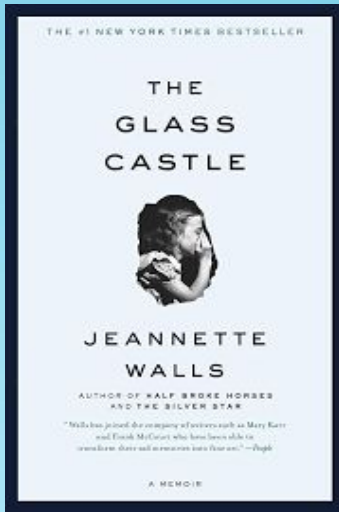


E208 SUMMER READING

- Being unprepared for E208 without reading this book will result in an extremely rough first month of school.



Disclaimer: Jeannette Walls grew up in the 1960s, so many of the social attitudes reflect a time period where marginalized groups were not represented well or accurately in society.

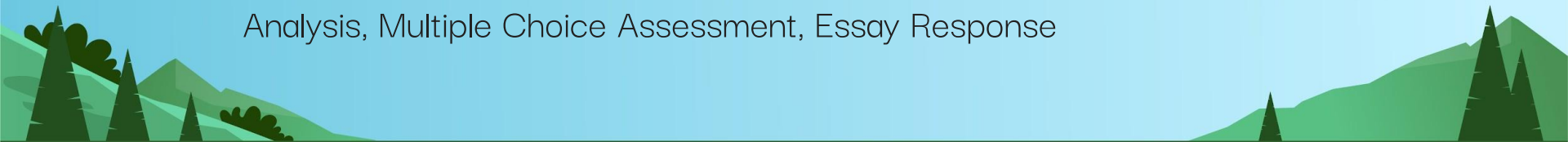
WHAT WILL WE BE DOING WITH SUMMER READING?



- **RHETORICAL ANALYSIS:** You have completed literary analysis tasks so far in E108 and *maybe* you have talked a little about rhetorical analysis.
 - ✓ Rhetorical Analysis is focused on nonfiction texts. So just like you analyzed literary elements in fiction and poetry texts in E108, we will work on those skills with nonfiction texts in E208.
 - ✓ Many of the “terms” (contrast, metaphor, repetition, etc.) are the same in literary and rhetorical analysis, we just analyze them differently :)

WHAT WILL THE RHETORICAL ASSESSMENTS LOOK LIKE?

- ☆ **Assessments could be any of the following:** Short Answer Quiz, Passage Analysis, Multiple Choice Assessment, Essay Response



WHAT WILL WE BE DOING WITH SUMMER READING?

- **SYNTHESIS WORK**: Depending on the teacher you have, you might dive into one of the critical issues presented in the book to further explore not only Jeannette Walls' experience/perspective/world, but also the world we inhabit and interact with
 - ✓ This is a task we will help you develop through writing, speeches and debates in E208. It is a skill we introduce you to, but you really master it in AP Lang :)
- **MEMOIR CREATIVE WRITING**: Depending on the teacher you have, you might use this introduction to the memoir genre to build your own narrative voice. We start our first semester with a selection of memoirs (*Born a Crime*, *First They Killed My Father*, *They Called Us Enemy*) and we use them as mentor texts in helping to write a piece of our own memoir
