



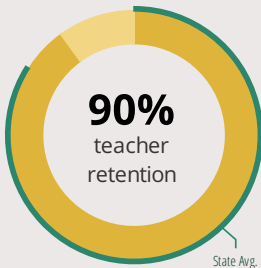
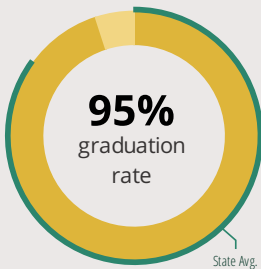
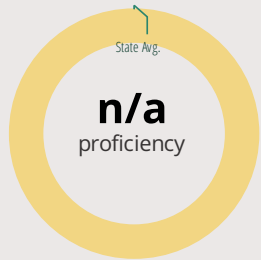

High school students take the SAT in Math and English Language Arts. The display shows SAT results in four performance levels.

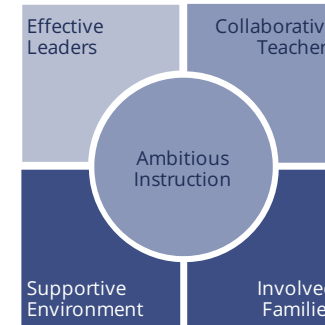
Success by Student Group

This display shows SAT performance levels for each student group. No data is shown for groups with fewer than 10 students.

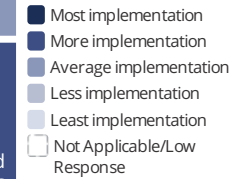

Physical Education, Heath and Wellness

Comprehensive wellness program fully integrating Physical Education and Health Education in 9th grade focusing on physical, emotional, and social well-being. Various PE courses including weight training, lifeguard training, individual sports, team sports, dance, aquatics, adventure education, yoga, gymnastics, and aerobic training.

The Dual Credit courses in the District allow for both high school credit and college credit. The enrollment requirements for these dual credit courses vary depending upon the specific college or university.

School Personnel Resources

While all SHS teachers are highly qualified, having at least a bachelor's degree in their content area, 150 staff have an advanced degree. 21 SHS teachers have National Board Certification. SHS also has a full-time nurse, 3 psychologists, 2 social workers, 10 counselors, and 2 speech/language/pathologists.

Facilities

Each District 211 high school is located on a 40-60 acre site, and able to accommodate 2,000-3,000 students. Each is equipped with an artificial turf stadium, running track, baseball and softball fields, swimming pool, multiple gymnasiums, tennis courts, an auditorium, and music practice rooms, plus computer, reading, business, science, and vocatio
