Rising sophomores:

Over the next few weeks, you will go through the process of requesting courses for next school year. Begin this process by talking to your parents/guardians, trusted adults, teachers and/or counselor.

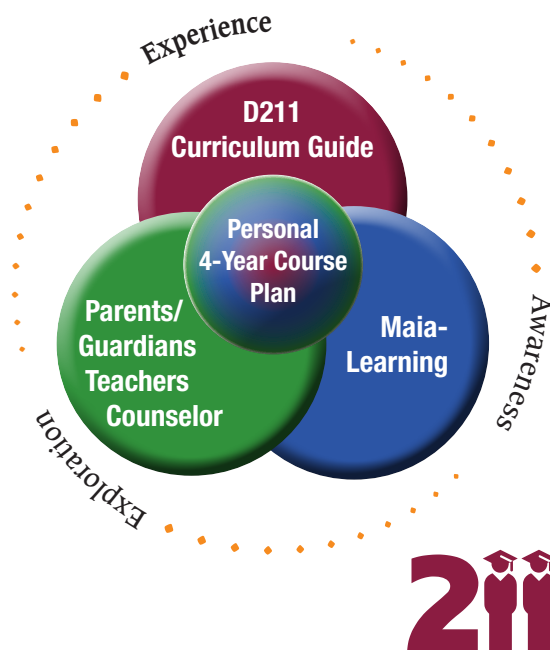
There are many factors to consider:

- Graduation Requirements (courses you must complete to earn a D211 diploma)
- Career areas of interest (review or complete your [MaiaLearning](#) Interest Profiler)
- College admission course requirements
- Courses aligned to your personal interests, hobbies and/or career aspirations
- Course prerequisite requirements
- Additional course fees
- Explore early college credit offered through dual credit and AP coursework
- Determine readiness for college level coursework in Math and English
- Participation requirements for IHSA athletics (students must be enrolled in at least four academic courses and wellness)
- NCAA Eligibility for Student Athletes (approved list of courses on page 8 of curriculum guide)

To organize your request process, we have provided requirements and course options on the back of this document. - ☐ You will finalize your requests with your counselor during your individual counselor meeting **between December 1, 2025 and January 15, 2026**.
- ☐ Your parents /guardians will be notified through their Infinite Campus account of your course requests on **January 20, 2026**; the deadline to make any changes to your course requests is Friday, **January 28, 2026**.

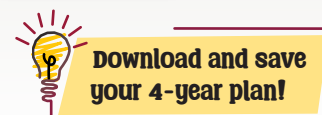

(Applied Technology, **OR** Business, **OR** Family Consumer Sciences Course)
- ☐ Fine Arts
(Art & Media **OR** Music)

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Must complete

- ☐ State Testing (Junior Year)
- ☐ Constitution Test (completed during Senior year Social Studies Course)
- ☐ FAFSA Completion (Senior Year)
- ☐ At least 20 units of credit
