 - School District 211 will provide access to a district Title I coordinator.
 - Will provide on-line access to the school improvement plan (SIP).
- 3. <u>Palatine High School</u> will hold an annual meeting to inform parents of the school's participation in Title I, Part A programs, and to explain the Title I, Part A requirements and the right of parents to be involved in Title I, Part A programs. - 8. <u>**Palatine High School**</u> will provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement, such as literacy training and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parental involvement, by:
 - Providing access to computers and training at parent meetings.
 - Providing training on the mechanics of using the parent access portal at open house, parent meetings or upon request.
 - Providing information on indirect and direct social emotional indicators.
 - Education Courses.
- 9. **Palatine High School** will take the following actions to ensure that information related to the school and parent-programs, meetings, and other activities is sent to parents of participating children in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request, and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand:
 - When possible, communications will be sent in English, Spanish and various formats.
