If you are addressing the Board via Zoom, your microphone will be turned on after I call your name. Again, please state your name for the record and, if you wish, indicate if you are a resident of the District. When you are finished, your microphone will be turned off.

Freedom of Information Act Requests

The Board of Education received and reviewed a report on Freedom of Information Act requests and responses.

2020-2021 School Year Update

Superintendent Small provided an update on the 2020-21 school year – including the invitation to all families that had selected remote learning to have their students attend school in-person and 300 families choosing to change their students to in-person learning; 56 percent of families selecting in-person learning and not all of these students attending school in-person; 44 percent of families choosing for their students to remain remote; students with incompletes from first semester getting individualized help and continuing their work during the second semester; 2021 advanced placement exams taking place in May and June; the PSAT 10, the freshman PSAT 9, the Illinois Science assessment for juniors being rescheduled by the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) for next school year; the ACCESS test for English Language services and the DLM assessment for a specific subset of students eligible for special education services being administered this semester; the ISBE removing the essay portion of the SAT exam; the SAT exam being administered to juniors on April 13, 2021 across the state; the ISBE waiving the SAT exam as a requirement in order to receive a diploma for the Class of 2021; credit completion opportunities for students who earned incompletes in a first semester course; opportunities for students receiving a failing grade or an audit for semester 1 classes that are graduation requirements having opportunities to enroll in District 211 Summer School, the Summer Advancement Invitational Program, or the Summer Incomplete Remediation Program; students earning incompletes at the end of semester two having the opportunity to enroll in the Summer Incomplete Remediation Program or to be provided additional resources through the end of the school year; the District administration having direct communication with the Cook County Department of Public Health (CCDPH); and the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) metric information being available on the District 211 COVID-19 Dashboard on District’s website.
