This is a lady that would tell you she is so proud of her family and grandkids and one who, at the same time, has made her life's work one of leadership in advancing education for the benefit of all students. May the sincere gratitude of the many, many people, including me, who have worked with you in these endeavors, serve as a type of payment. (Maybe you can't spend it, but it is from the heart and it's also tax-free!)

Thanks, Lynn and Deb, for becoming an important part of the District 211 family. You will be missed and we wish you the very best in future endeavors.
