Opioid Epidemic

Educate yourself

- What are opioids?
- Drugs that include heroin, synthetic opioids (fentanyl) and prescription pain relievers (Vicodin, OxyContin, morphine & Tylenol with codeine) and Opium.
- How do they affect the body?
- By acting on receptors in the spinal cord, brain to reduce the body's perception of pain.
- By stimulating the brain's reward system creating a sense of euphoria and well being.

Did you know?

- Deaths from heroin increased 328% between 2010 and 2015, and drug deaths from fentanyl and other synthetic opioids are now seeing a sharp rise as well. More Americans die from drug overdoses than in car crashes, and this increasing trend is driven by Rx painkillers.
- A 2017 study found most teens who misused prescription opioids first received the medicine from a doctor.
- Two-thirds of teens who report misuse of prescription medicine are getting it from friends, family and acquaintances.
- * More than half of young people who use heroin, start by using

Signs of Opioid Misuse

- Pinpoint pupil, dark circles under eyes
- Rapid weight loss
- + Fatigue, changes in sleep patterns
- Deterioration of hygiene or personal appearance
- Isolation from family & friends
- Mood changes such as agitation, depression or anxiety
- Missing prescription medications or empty pill bottles

How to Help

- Have conversation with teen about risk of opioid use and risks

- Seek alternatives for pain management with non addictive drugs like Advil, Motrin etc and physical therapy
- Practice Self Care
- If you think your child needs help get an evaluation and seek treatment options.
- Nalaxone(Narcan) is a medication that reverses overdose.
