On April 9, 2019, William Fremd High School will administer the State-required Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) to all juniors and the State-sponsored PSAT 10 to all sophomores. In order to accommodate facility needs and staff requirements to conduct these two assessments **freshman students will not attend school on Tuesday, April 9.**

I recommend your freshman child pursue educational opportunities independently on April 9. Please discuss these options with your child. With your assistance, your child can turn these opportunities into valuable educational experiences. These opportunities may include:

1. Study and research to address class obligations
2. College/university exploration or visits
3. Business/industry visits and job shadowing
4. Volunteer work

On Wednesday, April 10, 2019, all freshmen will complete the state-sponsored PSAT 9.

Test administration will begin at 7:30am and conclude at 11:00am, freshmen will be dismissed from school at that time. Students who require test accommodations beyond these times will have alternative transportation options. Buses will be available for those who normally use bus service to school and back according to their schedule.

The PSAT 9 assesses student knowledge in reading, writing and mathematics.
