A Current Profile

Township High School District 211 serves the communities of Hoffman Estates, Inverness, Palatine, Schaumburg, and portions of Arlington Heights, Elk Grove Village, Hanover Park, Rolling Meadows, Roselle, South Barrington, and Streamwood in the northwest suburbs of Chicago. The community is largely composed of business and professional people who commute to Chicago and its suburbs.

Five high schools serve grades 9-12. Each school has earned full recognition status by the State Superintendent of Schools of Illinois. All five high schools have received the United States Department of Education's Blue Ribbon Secondary Schools Award, and Palatine has been recognized twice. Palatine High School was one of only 10 schools nationally to be named a "New American High School" by the U.S. Department of Education in 2000. Three schools – Palatine, William Fremd, and Schaumburg High Schools – were named among the "Top 99" high schools in the country by *U.S. News & World Report*.

Graduation Requirements

1. Complete 18 academic units of credit
2. Physical education credit for each semester of attendance (*or equivalent*). P.E. courses earn .25 units of credit per semester.
3. Successfully complete:
 - a. One unit of United States History
 - b. One unit of Social Science Survey or ½ unit each of Government and Economics
 - c. Three years of mathematics course work, with successful completion of a 300-level course is required. One of the three required units must be Algebra I, and one unit must include Geometry content.
 - d. Two units of science (1 year — Biological Science/
1 year — Physical Science)
 - e. One unit of art, foreign language, music, or vocational education (*Applied Technology, Business Education, Family and Consumer Sciences*)
 - f. Four units of English
 - g. Two years of writing-intensive courses, one of which must be English.
 - h. One-half unit of Consumer Education (*or equivalent*)
 - i. One-half unit of Health
4. Complete 30 hours of instruction in safety education (*Driver Education classroom instruction*)
5. Pass a qualifying examination on the State and Federal Constitutions, Declaration of Independence, use of the American flag, and the Australian (*secret ballot*) method of voting
6. Participate in State testing at an appropriate level

- Five schools: James B. Conant, William Fremd, Hoffman Estates, Palatine, and Schaumburg High Schools. District 211 also has two special education schools, District 211 North Campus and Higgins Education Center, which serve approximately 175 special needs students.
